Policy for granting of exemption for UBC WOOD 120

The UBC Wood Products Processing Program offers an exemption from its first year course WOOD 120 (Introduction to Wood Products and Forest Management) for students who have successfully completed the WoodLINKS Introduction to Wood Products Manufacturing (UIWPM) 12 and Advanced Wood Products Manufacturing (UAWPM) 12 courses.

- A grade of B+ must have been achieved in both the above grade 12 courses for a student to be eligible for the exemption.
- An exemption from WOOD 120 will be given such that the total credit requirement of the Wood Products Processing Program will be reduced by three credits. Another course will not be required in the place of WOOD 120.
- To apply for this exemption a student should submit a letter of request to the Program Director of the Wood Products Processing Program. This request should be made once the student has been admitted into the Program.
